## TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BANYULE CRICKET CLUB INC -

The final result for the financial year ending 30 April 2024 was a deficit of \$10,628. This is a slight increase of \$857 on the prior years' deficit of \$9770.

### Revenue

**Membership revenue** increased by \$11,835. This increase is largely due to an increase in the number of senior playing members.

**Bar, Canteen & Dinners** recorded a \$11,723 gross margin. Sales were up on last year primarily due to two additional teams and operating from one home ground.

**Sponsorship** (net of function costs) was well up on last year by \$12,760 to \$27,310. "The Cordon" Corporate Sponsorship was the primary driver of the increase this year.

**Social & Fundraising Revenue** was down on last year driven by lower fundraising from the Toyota Good for Cricket raffle, two presentation nights in the prior year, as well as bar takings from the social events being reported under the Bar, Canteen and Dinners above.

**Grant income** of \$6,420 provided some important income that supported some extension to the nets. The overall grant income received this year was lower than the prior year due to the grant from the Victorian State Government – North East Link Program totalling \$46,361.90 for the concreting works extending the run ups in the cricket nets in the prior year.

The **Net Merchandising cost** was up on last year predominately driven by the decision to provide free player shirts and some apparel to players this year with our new sponsors. We don't expect the same level of net cost next year.

### Expenses

**Cricket expenditure** was higher than last year, with higher player payments and incentives compared to the prior year and an increase in match and practice ball purchases with more teams.

**Buildings and Grounds** costs were significantly lower than last year due to the new concrete works that were paid for last year (and fully funded by the state government grant last year). Ground hire costs were higher this year with the increased number of teams.

**Administration costs** were overall lower this year, with lower printing and stationary spend and the CPR course not being run this year.

**Depreciation and Amortisation** is in line with the prior year and relates to the bowling machine, concrete slab, marquee and synthetic grass that were purchased two years ago. These capital costs are being expensed over the next 5 years of estimated useful life.

Despite recording a deficit for the year, predominately driven by the decision to offer the free playing shirts and some apparel to players, the club is in a sound financial position with \$49,616 of Cash at Bank. This is after it has paid the outstanding creditors after year end and received the funds for the sale of bar stock. Thanks to all the captains and to the Junior and Senior Committee members who ensured the season ran successfully.

Finally, I would personally like to thank Thea Oliver for her fantastic bookkeeping support again this year. Looking forward to another successful cricket season in FY24/25.

## BOARD OF MANAGEMENT - PLAYING REPORTS

Initially nominating 6 senior sides and then adding a 7<sup>th</sup> in early October is the envy of many clubs we play against. It does however require an enormous amount of administrative organisation, commitment from players at various stages of their cricketing journeys, and also enormous energy from the coaching group who must manage this and the expectations that go with it. To have upwards of 50 plus players training on any given senior night was an organisational challenge, albeit a pleasant one for the future of the club.

Particular mention must go to the senior coach Brent O'Connor and his 'numbers man' James McIntyre who handled this superbly. This extended to a streamlined selection process that meant that communication and process was well understood. The issue of ongoing forfeits by opposition sides in the lower grades was about the only thing they couldn't control.

The 2023-24 season represented an opportunity for the 1<sup>st</sup> XI to re-set. After a chastening previous year in Barclay Shield that culminated in relegation, it was off to Money Shield. Naturally there was a degree of optimism but nothing is given and so it proved over the course of a fluctuating season. Invariably positive performances were followed by those that were less flattering. Continuing an unhealthy trend from previous years, we were also to lose key players for extended portions of the season, particularly on the bowling front.

The season commenced with a one dayer and a resounding thrashing of Greensborough, highlighted by an aggressive run chase. The following game was a complete reversal where the batting folded dramatically against Montmorency in pursuit of a gettable target. The start of the two days saw another compelling batting display and Eltham were never in the hunt in reply. What then followed were 2.5 wins in the next five games so that at around early January we were on the edge of the top four.

Unfortunately a run of four successive losses, including narrow losses against Lalor and Bundoora Park cruelled any finals ambitions. In the penultimate round we were able to find form and convincingly defeat the then top placed Plenty before finishing off with a flat defeat against eventual premiers Bundoora United.

Connor Braniff with 581 runs and selection in the Money Shield team of the year was a revelation. His intent and aggression was matched with a good technique and his performance represented an absolute break out year. There were times when he left some runs behind so the scope for more improvement is certainly there. Of the others only Julian Drohan (283) and Brent O'Connor (266) were able to exceed 200 runs, and both also had scope for a few more. Adam Samad showed great determination and flexibility within the batting order and he too is starting to show signs at the level.

The bowling at times was undermanned but performed credibly throughout. All-rounders Julian Drohan (22) and Brent O'Connor (17) led the way and only Josh Neilson after his late season inclusion exceeded 10 wickets. The extended absence of both Michael Hannan and Jeremy Mahar was certainly felt at times and it is to be hoped a full season from both of them will help with adding a cutting edge to the attack. Debutant bowlers Nick Bowler and Leo Hobson-Nicholls in particular showed much promise, and Jack Arandt with a pragmatic thought process to spin bowling, bowled with good economy when called upon.

The fielding was at times of a variable standard which was a disappointment given the work that was put in during training on this aspect of the game. Graham Bennett returned to 1<sup>st</sup> team cricket and kept excellently throughout. Of the younger players not previously mentioned, Braydon O'Connor, Jake Lee and Josh Neilson showed encouraging signs in limited opportunities. Congratulations should also go out to Brodie Johnson, Mark Ryan, Nicholas Bowler, Justin Dillon, Braydon O'Connor, and Leo Hobson-Nicholls who all made their 1<sup>st</sup> XI debuts for the club during the season.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI in B Grade under the leadership of the experienced Jeff Wilson was anticipated to improve and challenge strongly given the increased playing depth. The challenge as always for a club 2<sup>nd</sup> XI is to gain results at the same time as having the depth of talent ready to compete at 1<sup>st</sup> XI level. After a humbling defeat in the opening round against Rosanna, the side was to lose only one further game until the final round of the season.

There were a number of tight hard fought wins over the season including matches against Heidelberg, Epping and the return fixture against Rosanna. Arguably the best victory of the season was against North Eltham when defending a hard earned 171 away from home. Ultimately the last home and away game and semi-final (both also against North Eltham) resulted in narrow defeats and an end to the season a weekend earlier than was to be hoped.

The batting was generally well organised and the experienced trio of Daryl Kennedy (280), Ryan Hartnett (230), and Jeff Wilson (213) were significant contributors, particularly when things got tight in games. Of the others Jake Lee with an excellent innings in the semi-final, and Jackson Bowler showed positive signs for the



future. Jeff Wilson (24) led the wicket takers and had good support from Cam Ataryniw (19) and Flynn Davis (16). Tom Elmer was niggardly throughout and Scott Clapton was a point of difference late in the season. An individual highlight was leg spinner Jaxon McIntyre taking 7/32 against Montmorency. The returning Ryan Hartnett with 24 dismissals to complement his batting was also a major reason the side improved over the season

The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI under first time captain Ollie McGillion, found themselves in D Grade when the fixtures were released, and often against other teams 2<sup>nd</sup> XI's. A tough season was anticipated but what transpired was an epic season that had them miss finals by the narrowest of margins. During the season a tie and a last over loss to eventual premiers Bundoora Park, and a lengthy final wicket partnership that saw Rosebank prevail in the penultimate round is where the season probably swung. Ollie did a superb job with this XI allowing for the fact that 40 players represented this side during the season.

Runs were at times hard to come by and only Ollie McGillion exceed 200 runs. It should be noted that a number of players made telling contributions at critical times with Liam O'Connor and Jaxon McIntyre scoring debut senior 50's. Will Barnes and Ryder McMurray when available showed quality at the level. Of the younger players, Liam Adair and Anish Jadhav showed a good technique in the top order and fought hard.

With the ball wickets were shared with Ollie McGillion (24) leading the way. First year player Tarun Ohri bowled with real pace and is an excellent 'middle aged' prospect. Others to have moments with the ball included Josh Kapsalis, Daniel Murray, as well as the co-hort of Clapton, Davis, Elmer, Neilson, Hobson-Nicholls and Johnson who also found themselves in the 1<sup>st</sup> XI at varying points during the season. Ben Wilson displayed his obvious all round talent and a returning Waheed Kazi was a great addition to the group.

The 4<sup>th</sup> XI under David Veal, played in F1 despite being winless in this grade in 2022-23. This side was one of two Banyule sides in F Grade and a decision was made that this side would be predominantly a younger XI. At the outset it was hoped that this side would be competitive but the reality was performances far exceeded expectations, and the side was in the top four all season long. The side had some uplifting victories along the way including an early season win and a hard fought semi-final victory both over Greensborough.

The batting was highlighted by Daniel Murray (199) which included a superb counter attacking 85 in the winning semi-final. James McIntyre, Tom Braddy and Michael Delaney all had moments and tallied around 150 runs each. The young bowling attack bowled with tremendous awareness throughout and was very even with Ryan Forbes, Daniel Murray, Josh Kapsalis, Nick Aston and Declan O'Connor all taking between 10-15 wickets over the course of the year. In a side that often had a higher percentage of under 18 year old players, the 21 year old 'veteran' Jamie Marks kept wickets tremendously throughout to complement his much improved batting.

There were some excellent individual performances along the way including Sam Place batting nearly all day in oppressive heat at Research for 96, and Connor Lennox smashing his highest senior score of 76 in a one-dayer against Greensborough. Leo Hobson Nicholls with 11 wickets at an average of 2.09 showed why he merited a 1<sup>st</sup> XI debut later in the season. The highlight however was the making of a Grand Final. To have an experienced Heidelberg 3<sup>rd</sup> XI out for 130 on day one was a great opportunity. Unfortunately a lack of experience in the chase saw the 4<sup>th</sup> XI come up short, but should not detract from what was an exceptional season. Full credit should go to David Veal.

The 5<sup>th</sup> XI played in F3 which was a mix of one and two day cricket and was led by the experienced Geoff Place. The side was predominantly an older playing group who prefer Saturday cricket over Veterans cricket (or combine the two). They were to be complemented by a mix of junior players and those of irregular commitments. This side was another that was highly competitive, particularly when finding themselves matched up against other sides 3<sup>rd</sup> XI's.

After being thrashed in the 1<sup>st</sup> game by Research, the side was to be relatively consistent from then on, highlighted by never losing consecutive games. With three powerful sides in the grade, a win over South Morang in the penultimate game would have seen an eminently winnable final game lead to a finals appearance. Unfortunately not being able to defend 275 was to cruel any thought of finals.

The side was generally pretty well performed with the bat. Paul Davis (264), Andrew Parry (226), Peter Cargin (191) and Adrian Stapleton (161) all played well. With the ball Peter Cargin (26) wickets and a very high percentage of unassisted wickets was superb throughout. Paul Davis again bowled with ageless intelligence in support.

The 6<sup>th</sup> XI were a dedicated one day graded side and played in G2. They were captained by Steve Pinner and he was to lead a number of promising junior players, including seven of whom he coached to an U14 premiership. The side was to win six of their 14 games played and only narrowly missed finals. This was an

excellent effort given the first 'actual' victory did not come until R9. A number of Forfeit wins somewhat enhanced the ladder position, but was little compensation for the frustration felt in not actually playing.

With the bat Steve Pinner (279) and Luke Ryan (187) were consistent throughout. Darcy Pinner, Mitch McKellar, Michael Harper, Sam Dennis, and Jahan Dhruve showed promise in their first extended tastes of senior cricket. With the ball Jake Kennedy was to win the G2 competition bowling award. He was rewarded for bowling a full length and having the ability to move the new ball. Darcy Pinner with his leg spin and fast left armer, Ellio Conceicao were others who also showed promise with the ball. Special mention should also go to Sam Dennis who worked in a very conscientious manner with the wicketkeeping.

The 7<sup>th</sup> XI were a dedicated one day graded side and played in G3. They were lead in combination by the experienced pairing of Alistair Howell and Graeme Renshaw. Any assessment of the 7<sup>th</sup> XI is unfortunately clouded by the amount of forfeits this side was given. Of 16 scheduled fixtures, five forfeits, two byes, and two washouts, meant that the side only played seven games. A first actual win did not occur until R13 and yet perversely the side was to finish 5<sup>th</sup>. This was an excellent ladder position given that we were often playing other sides 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> XI's.

As expected player performances were limited with Shadi Haila and Aryan Mittal being the standout players. Aryan in particular has a very promising future and could comfortably leap a couple of grades in the near future as a talented all-rounder. Joshua Seneca showed ability with the bat and gloves, and Ellio Conceicao and Ayaan Ohri also showed much promise.

It is a big club to manage but we have much to look forward given the enthusiasm of our Coach Brent O'Connor, and the manner in which we transitioned a number of junior players in to the senior club. A focus on retention, development and well targeted recruitment will help ensure future success.
